Rosa Luxemburg (1871–1919) was one of the most creative writers of modern socialism, a leading Jewish intellectual and the foremost female theoretician of European radicalism.

Kate Evans, artist and author of *Red Rosa*, will discuss how she created the cartoon biography of Rosa Luxemburg.

Rory Castle (Swansea University) will discuss the life, thought and legacy of Rosa Luxemburg.

Marie-Louise Luxemburg (Bath Royal Literary and Scientific Institute), Rosa Luxemburg's great niece, will discuss Rosa's elusive brother, Nathan.

Alejandra Crosta (University of Oxford), translator of *Red Rosa* into Spanish, will discuss intertextuality in the translation.
